'WHAT TO TAKE TO THE REGISTRARS'

What to take to the Registrars

You should take all of the following:

- The Medical Certificate of the cause of death
- The Deceased's National Health Medical Card
- The Deceased's Birth Certificate & Marriage Certificate (if applicable)

THE REGISTRAR WILL REQUIRE THE FOLLOWING DETAILS:

Deceased details

Full name

Home address

Date and place of death

Date and place of birth

Last occupation

Date of birth of surviving partner

Whether Deceased was in receipt of a pension or allowance from Public Funds

IF THE DECEASED WAS A MARRIED WOMAN:

Maiden name:

Husband's full name (even if deceased)

Husband's last occupation (even if deceased)

INFORMANT DETAILS

The informant is the person who is registering the death – i.e. You

Full name:

In return for the information that you give the registrar, the registrar will give you:

- A green certificate - You must hand this to us. Without this, the funeral can't take place
- A white certificate- this is for Social Security purposes and must be sent to them.

The Registrar will sell you copies of the Death Certificate. You may need this for the Will, or for any Pension Claims, Insurance Policies, Saving Banks Certificates or Premium Bonds.
